Act 2022-421 Meetings of Governmental Bodies

- 1. Allows board members to attend meetings electronically and can count toward the quorum as long as three members or majority of quorum whichever is less are three in person.
- 2. The board member attending electronically can participate in executive sessions.
- 3. Board member attending by electronic means that way to hear the meeting electronically needs to be included in the public notice of meetings.
- 4. Allowing the public to access this electronic means to hear the meeting does not require the Board to allow the public to participate electronically.
- 5. This is not allowed when the Board is involved in employment actions, adoption of administrative rules or disciplinary hearings for licensees.
- 6. Will be required to use roll call vote when board member participating by electronic means.
- 7. A member attending electronically cannot claim reimbursement expenses related to the meeting including mileage and per diem. The member could get the fee paid to attend the board meeting if set out by that Board's statute.
- 8. If the electronic means fails during the meeting that failure will not be grounds to challenge any action taken during the meeting.

This Act goes into effect on July 1, 2022

- (d) Each meeting in which members of a governmental body are participating by electronic means as authorized in this section shall be held at a physical location available for persons wishing to be physically present, at which any interested member of the public shall be able to hear all persons who are participating remotely.
- (e) Any vote taken at a meeting utilizing the equipment authorized by subsection (a) shall be taken as a roll call vote that allows each participant to vote individually in a manner audible to all persons participating or present at the physical location provided for in subsection (d).
- (f) A member participating in a meeting by electronic means as provided by this section may not claim any form of reimbursement for expenses relating to that meeting, including mileage.
- Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 21 first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
